MJ Lindo 's creative journey was sparked by her experiences as a young child. Shaped by the civil war in Nicaragua, her family soon relocated to Toronto, where she found a fresh curiosity and inspiration in the city's subway murals that spawned a lifelong dedication to art. Now, as a full-time muralist in the Bay Area, she and her husband, Joshua Lawyer, operate under the name Rough Edge Collective

Joshua Lawyer was raised in East Palo Alto and grew up in a strong Tongan culture, rich in tradition. Although art was deeply woven into that culture. It was through the 1990s Bay Area street art scene—and seeing public spaces transformed—that Joshua found his life's passion.

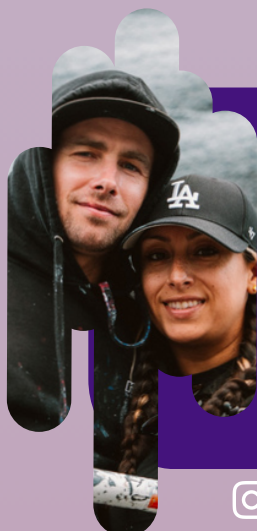

Eric Skotnes is a Los Angeles-based urban artist known for interconnecting disparate styles into an aesthetically integrated whole. Skotnes creates murals and works on canvas that juxtapose his wild style graffiti with figural renderings of classical sculptures from Antiquity.

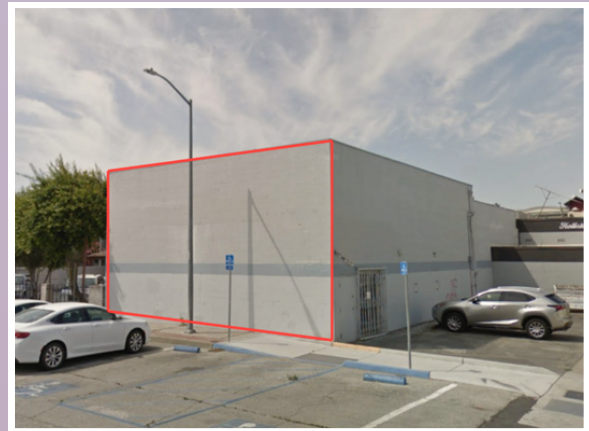
